

Well, we are pulling all the shakes down, and are going to put up a 100 year lifetime metal roof. It will be a beautiful Forest Green! We are adding 1.5 inch thick foam insulation while we are at it. The roof will also increase the fire safety of the cabin and be self cleaning in the winter.
